CLASP Student Profile for 2016 - 2017

- Low income - 82%
- English language learners - 35%
- Homeless - 25%
- Ethnicity - 70% Hispanic, 14% Asian, 9% Caucasian, 6% Black, and 1% American Indian/Alaska Native
- 146 students participated in 8,832 tutoring sessions

CLASP Volunteers and Staff for 2016 - 2017

- 287 volunteer tutors included 111 community members, 55 college students, 87 high school students, and 27 substitutes
- The Board of Directors has 24 members, including two students from Claremont High School. Many of these members also served on one or more of our 10 CLASP committees, and were joined by another 20 non-Board members from the Claremont community.
- 7,406 total volunteer tutoring hours were contributed!
- Our paid staff is all part-time, and includes the Program Director, an Office Assistant, Tutor Coordinator, five Site Supervisors, and eight Recreation Leaders.

CLASP highlights for 2016 - 2017

- CLASP had its very successful 2nd annual *Celebrate CLASP!* event on September 25, 2016, at the Pomona College Studio Art building. The event honored David and Claire Oxtoby for their years of support of CLASP and proved to be a very successful friend raiser and fundraiser for CLASP.
- Program Director Jan Creasey worked very hard again this year with CUSD TOSA (Teacher on Special Assignment) staff to provide critically important tutor training workshops on Fridays for our volunteer tutors in the areas of Common Core math and language arts. These workshops were well attended, with generally over 25 tutors at each one. Tutors found them to be quite helpful!
- All CLASP sites were supplied with the Teacher Editions for Common Core Math. For each grade level, there is now a binder with full-size student copies and full-size answer sheets for each lesson to help tutors become more familiar with the new methods.
- We organized 262 hours of program support enrichment with supplementary art, music, and STEM activities for the students, plus Game and Literacy Nights for both parents and children.
- Harvey Mudd College's *Science Day* was held Saturday, March 4, 2017, and CLASP students were there to participate in a fun-filled day of science activities and demonstrations.
- CLASP's *Toyota Youth Symphony Field Trip* to the Disney Concert Hall on January 21, 2017, saw 48 CLASP students, respective family members and staff enjoy an afternoon of fabulous music.
- *Engineering for Kids* presented rocket-building activities at each CLASP site for our students.
- The CLASP Summer Camp program at Mt. San Antonio Gardens just wrapped up its third year. This intergenerational program offers free transportation to the site, educational games, recreation, swimming, and *lunch with a buddy* four days a week for two weeks for 23 lucky students!
